About the course

This qualification reflects the role of individuals in a range of community settings and peoples' homes, who provide support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work according to and may contribute to an individualised plan, and work without direct supervision.

They may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

The skills in this qualification must be applied in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian standards and industry codes of practice. No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

Who should enrol

Passionate and caring individuals seeking the opportunity to receive accredited training in the care sector. Applicants should possess a calm, patient nature and should be capable of operating within a team as well as with some independence.

Learning outcomes

Successful completion of this course will enable you to gain a nationally accredited qualification in an industry which offers a broad range of employment opportunities.

Attendance, study load and student support

You will be required to:

- Attend all Online delivery (including simulated activities), this includes 4 hours every 3 4 weeks throughout the 13-month program (excluding course breaks).
- Participate in learning activities; readings, case studies, projects, quizzes, self-paced learning and other tasks including individual research in your own time (approximately 8-10 hours per unit of competency for the average learner)
- Undertake theory and practical assessment activities (approximately 20-25 hours per unit of competency).
 - Details and expectations of activities will be provided in individual training plans. Student support is available at the end of each class. Scheduled support sessions will also be available if required.

Work experience/placement

To successfully complete this course and gain hands on experience you must complete a minimum of 120 hours of work placement, within a suitable workplace. Suitable workplace includes residential facilities, respite care facilities, day care centres, home care environments, community support settings, rehabilitation services and refuges.

Your assessments will be contextualized to your current workplace, you may be asked to complete a project relevant to your current employment.

Your Trainer/Assessor may undertake skills, an observation assessment at appointed intervals throughout your training.

Assessment

Assessment will include a range of activities such as written tasks, oral questions and skills demonstration within a simulated and/or actual work environment.

N.B. Students need to be aware of, and consent to video record themselves for the purpose of gathering and submitting workplace assessment evidence relating to specific performance tasks.



Entry requirements

Wesley Vocational Institute has set the following entry requirements for enrolment in this course:

Be employed on a casual, part-time or full-time basis with a disability care provider or within a Disability Service.

Ability to commit to the attendance and study load requirements of this course.

Satisfactory level of language, literacy and numeracy.

Be an Australian/New Zealand citizen, Australian Permanent Resident or Humanitarian visa holder

Reliable computer and internet access.
